COMMUNION AT ST. TIMOTHY'S

Dipping the bread into the wine is not permitted due to health concerns.

To participate in communion, please step into the center aisle and walk up to the priest holding the bread. A blessed wafer of bread will be placed into your outstretched hands. Consume the wafer, then you may step into the line to sip the blessed wine from the common cup, or you may forego the cup and return to your seat.

To receive a blessing, please step into the center aisle and walk up to the priest with your arms crossed over your chest. The priest will bless you, and then you may return to your seat.
